Pheasant class visit to Chichester Harbour Conservancy

Pheasant class' recent trip to Chichester Harbour Conservancy and Chichester County Hall was a treat for all concerned. A beautiful winter's day greeted the children at the harbour where they got into role (as conservationists, ramblers and even government officials) and went on a fabulous geographical learning walk in the local area. The children then wrote their own proposal about the topical issue of Britain's "Coastal Pathway," using all of their learning from their most recent Learning Journey on debating. A trip to County Hall followed, where the class excelled at showing off their debating skills, impressing everyone with their maturity and thoughtful points of view.

Safer Internet Day

As a finale to their e-safety Learning Journey, all children in year 6 visited West Dean CE Primary school to participate in a workshop lead by e-safety expert, Mr. Alan Mackenzie. During the workshop, the children explored how to stay safe online and discussed how to use social media safely and responsibly. The children have created an excellent display of what they have learnt through this Learning Journey, and this is now up in our school hall. Do pop in to have a look.

Visit from the Bishop of Horsham

Following our 'Outstanding' grading at our SIAMs inspection last year, the Bishop of Horsham visited school on Tuesday 6th February to see for himself the fabulous learning taking place across the school. The Bishop conducted a tour of the school and chatted to children and staff about the benefits of working and learning in a small village C of E controlled school. The Bishop has informed us that he had a very enjoyable and informative day and thanked the children and whole school community for the warm welcome he received.

Woodpecker Class Fair Trade

Woodpecker class are currently undertaking an exciting learning Journey all about Fair Trade. This learning Journey is very timely as it is currently National Fair Trade fortnight. It is hoped that by the end of their studies, we will be able to apply for a Fair Trade awareness award for the school The children will be presenting what they have learnt during a special celebration assembly on Thursday 8th March

Health and Safety

I am delighted to inform you that, following a recent Health and Safety monitoring inspection, the inspector found that 'Standards of health and safety at Lavant CofE **Primary school are excellent.'** The physical and emotional wellbeing and safety of your children is always of the upmost importance to us. On this theme however, a few issues have recently been brought to my attention that I would appreciate your support in.

Safety arriving and leaving school

A few parents have recently brought to my attention that some drivers are irresponsibly parking very close to, or even over, the pedestrian crossing point outside the school. This makes it very dangerous for parents and young children to cross. **Please park responsibly.** We are currently working with the Highways Department to make improvements to the pedestrian crossing and the footpaths at the school entrance.

Some children are also walking into school via the staff car park, which, for safety reasons is not allowed. If dropping your child at the turning circle, please do so at the designate

dropoff point so your child can enter via the safe pedestrian access point. Children arriving at school after 9am when the main school gates are shut **must enter via the main entrance accompanied by an adult. The adult must sign the child in stating a reason in the late book. Children must not be left to come into school unaccompanied.**

Cough sweets

Recently a number of children have been bringing cough sweets into school. Although I understand that a tickly cough is annoying, I am afraid cough sweets are not allowed in school as they contain medication and are a choking hazard.

Lip balm.

During the cold weather a number of children suffer from chapped lips. I am happy for children to bring in '**Non flavoured'** lip balm into school, that can be kept in their tray. Please do remind your child however, that they are not to share a lip balm with other children in school.

PE kits

It is really important that children have regular exercise throughout each week and it is important that every child has a **full PE kit** in school every day. If a child has not got a kit in school they are not to borrow other children's kits across the school as we have had reports of some items of kit going missing. Thank you for your support in this.

Nuts

Please remember we are a nut free school and do have children with nut allergies in school. Children must not have not have nuts or nut based products in their lunchboxes. This includes Nutella Chocolate Spread.

Bullying

We are very pleased that incidents of bullying are very rare at our school. If however, any child reports that they, or another child, may be being bullied, this is something we take very seriously. Children are able to report any concern they have to any adult in school who will always listen to them and take any concerns seriously. All children involved are spoken to and full accounts of any accusations are listened to and acted upon. If the situation is considered to be of a bullying nature, parents of all children involved are contacted and we work together to find a swift resolution to the problem. All staff are made aware of ongoing concerns and are vigilant in monitoring relationships in class and on the play ground.

Parent Workshops

In response to recent parent requests we have planned two parent workshops to be held over the coming weeks.

Spelling workshop - 9am Wednesday 7th March

As you are aware we are currently developing and improving our approach to teaching and learning spellings across the school. We have altered the way in which we are asking chidlren to learn their spellings and have invested in an online program to help your children develop spelling strategies in a fun and engaging way on line. Mrs Upjohn will be outlining key changes to our approach and giving you some helpful tips as to how you can support your child at home.

Growth mindset – 9am Friday 23rd March

Many of you have commented on the positive benefits you have already seen as your children are learning about their brain and the importance of developing a 'Growth Mindset'. This is a very exciting concept we are all committed to in school and, during this workshop, Mr King, Mr Taylor, and children will be explaining the science behind this concept, and importance of us all developing a Growth mindet within our own lives.

If at all possible, please do come along to both workshops. It will be great to see you there.
