Following the success of our Forest Schools programme over the last two years we are delighted to be able to continue the project again next year.

Next half term children in Year 4 will be visiting Kingley Vale on a Thursday afternoons with Mrs Upjohn. The sessions will start on the 11th January and will continue for five weeks, until 8th February. Each session will be led by Julia Shepherd and Rachel Maynard from Chichester Forest Schools. Both are experienced level 3 Forest School practitioners with Wilderness First Aid Training. They are fully insured and DBS checked.

On Forest School days the children will need to wear, long trousers and long sleeved shirts and bring waterproofs and wellies or walking boots. (The appropriate footwear for Forest Schools **must not** be worn to school in the morning but brought in a bag ready to change into after lunch.)

As last year, the children will be transported to Kingley Vale after their lunch and will return to school in time for the end of the school day.

All feedback regarding Forest Schools last year was incredibly positive and I certainly know the children thoroughly enjoyed their session each week. This half term the children will be working on skills linked to their learning in class on the Saxons. As well as supporting this learning, it is well documented that Forest School sessions also help to:

- Build confidence and self esteem
- Improve motivation and encourage co operation
- Encourage responsibility, independence and the management of risk
- Improve language, communication and social skills

- Improve physical motor skills
- Increase understanding of the physical environment and seasonal change
- Encourage a positive attitude to learning
