Dear Parents,

We have lots of exciting school trips planned for this term to help enthuse and engage your children in their learning. We appreciate that we will be asking for a significant contribution for these visits but we hope that by giving you plenty of notice that you'll be able to budget for this. We have tried to keep costs to a minimum, and The Friends have kindly subsidised these visits, but we would appreciate a voluntary contribution of £28.00 to cover transport, insurance, entry fees and workshops. Although the contribution is voluntary, we do need to point out that it is probable that the visits will not take place unless all parents, who are able, are willing to contribute. As a school we do not have the resources to fund these visits totally ourselves. Please do speak to Mr King or one of us in confidence if you are unable to contribute on this occasion. We are happy to accept payments in two installments of £14.00 if this proves easier. Also, if your child is in receipt of pupil premium, we would be looking for a reduced voluntary contribution.

Our first visit takes place this half term and is to the Cass Sculpture Foundation at Goodwood, on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> May. The children will be travelling by County mini bus and spending the morning there. They will have a picnic lunch before coming back to school for the afternoon.

After half term on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> June the children will be visiting The Weald and Downland Museum to take part in a 'Farming through the ages' workshop. To try and keep costs down we will take the children to the Museum by car and be asking you to collect your child/ren from the Museum at 2.30pm. We hope by giving you plenty of notice you will be able to sort these arrangements but if you have any issues please let us know in plenty of time.

We would appreciate any parental help with transporting children to the Weald and Downland museum visit. If you are able to assist with this please let us know as soon as possible. (We would aim to leave school at approx. 9.50am)

Finally on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> June, we will be returning to Tuppenny Barn to follow up on our previous visit to sow, harvest and cook with the produce grown on site. We are hoping that this practical session linking farming, seasonality and cooking will bring to life the food technology elements of the DT curriculum. The children will again be travelling by County mini bus.

For all of the above educational visits the children will need to bring a packed lunch. If your child normally has a Chartwells hot meal, please remember to cancel this for the appropriate days well in advance.
