## **Attendance**

Congratulations to Woodpecker Class who had the highest attendance of the spring term. In addition, a very well done to all the children as our overall attendance so far this year has risen from 95.7% in the Autumn term back up to 96.6% by Easter.

## Walk to school Week - Monday 21st - Friday 25th May

Later this term we will be celebrating 'National Walk to School Week' when we encourage as many of you as possible to walk to school, rather than jump in the car. If you live some distance away, then you may like to consider parking on the estate and walking through the allotments to school. This is called a 'park and stride' and will not only give you all some extra fresh air in the morning, but also greatly reduce the congestion outside the school. Throughout the week, the children will be recording their mode of transport and will receive a sticker for taking part. Please can I take this opportunity to remind all parents that we do not allow parking, or waiting, in the school car park, and that, if you absolutely need to park in West Stoke Road, you park safely.

















#### **UNIFORM**

**Polite Reminder** – (Extract from September newsletter)

Please ensure that your child has all the required uniform (including full PE kit) in school every day. Our policy clearly states that **sensible black or navy flat shoes** are part of the school uniform requirements. Boots and shoes of other colours are therefore not acceptable footwear.

If your child does not have the correct uniform please ensure you notify the school in writing. Please note that large brightly coloured hair bows are not school uniform and should not be worn.

The only jewellery allowed in school is stud earrings (no hoops, necklaces or bracelets). This is for health and safety reasons. Studs need to be removed / taped for PE. If your child is unable to do this themselves then earrings are to be left at home that day.

#### **Water Bottles**

As the weather will hopefully now be warming up children must also ensure they have their **school water bottle** in school every day. It is really important that children stay hydrated throughout the day and this is something we actively encourage children to do. The Friends generously provide every child with a new water bottle at the start of each academic year and these should always be in school. Children are welcome to take their water bottle home daily for a wash and refill - we do insist they go home at least at the end of every week for a thorough clean. **Please note that children should only bring in the standard school bottle which must be filled with water - not squash.** Replacement bottles can be purchased for £1.00 at the school office.

#### Sun cream and sun hats

As the warmer weather arrives, please ensure you apply sun cream to your child before the start of the school day. Many brands now sell 'all day' sun cream which means there is no need for children to bring bottles of cream in to school. Please also ensure that your child has an appropriate sun hat to wear outside.



Finally, we are really pleased to be part of a new initiative call 'Operation Encompass'. This is a unique Police and Education early intervention safeguarding partnership which supports children and young people exposed to domestic abuse. Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools before the start of the next school day when a child or young person has been involved or exposed to a domestic abuse incident the previous evening. The information is given in strict

confidence to a school's Designated Safeguarding Lead (Mr. King and Mr. Taylor) to enable support to be given dependent on the needs and wishes of the child. If you would like to know any more about this, please don't hesitate to pop in and ask!
