Identified barriers to learning

A few children including children eligible for PP lack resilience, and are afraid to make mistakes.

A few children including pupils eligible for PP lack focus or find it hard to sustain concentration in class.

A few children including children eligible for PP lack self-confidence or struggle with friendships.

Some children with PP lack life experiences and have low expectations of themselves as learners (and writers).

Home learning environments can limit some children's learning – there is a need for us to provide homework support, parenting skills, and positive role models

Impact of Support 17/18

We maintained high adult to pupil ratios for our youngest children in EYFS and Key stage one, This enabled them to settle into school quickly and also helped us to identify concerns quickly and put in place early intervention support. This strategy has had a positive impact progress and attainment

Through our Learning Mentor support children's self-esteem and confidence has grown providing the pupils' with a more positive attitude to their learning and sense of worth.

1 out of 2 children attained a Good Level of Development (GLD) and both children made good progress from their starting points.
KS1

Reading

• 67% of PP children Achieved Age related expectations (Cohort 81%)

Writing

67% of PP children Achieved Age related expectations (Cohort 69%)

Maths

67% of PP children Achieved Age related expectations (Cohort 81%)

67% of PP children met Age related expectations in reading, writing and maths compared to 69% of the whole cohort. This is a significant improvement from previous years

KS2 Progress Scores

Children in receipt of PP attained highly with an average scaled score of 107.8 compared to the rest of the cohort (105.5)

Children in receipt of PP made less progress than their peers in school and nationally. This is something we are monitoring closely and working hard to improve.

Attendance

In 2017/18 the average attendance for PP children rose to 96.3. This is a rise of 3% in 3 years.

Attendance continues to be carefully monitored.
