It is hard to believe we are already approaching our first half term break. It was great to see so many of you at parent consultations this week; thank you for your overwhelmingly positive feedback as to how useful and informative you find these meetings.

The children have been immersed in a number of creative learning experiences over the past few weeks and have particularly enjoyed a number of fantastic enrichment activities. I have included a very brief snapshot from each class.

Fire Crew visiting Wren class



Wren Class has had a very exciting visit from the Fire service. They learned about the job of a Fire Fighter: how they help us, what they wear, what tools are stored on a fire engine etc. They even went inside the fire engine and heard the siren. Finally they all had the opportunity to help direct the hose and feel the power of the water. They all had such fun.

Robin Class - The Day the Crayons Quit!



Robin Class came to school dressed in their favourite colours as an exciting hook for their current Learning Journey about the book: *The Day the Crayons Quit!* They read the story where the crayons had written letters to their owner, Duncan, to explain why they were quitting. The children have been learning colour mixing, talking about feelings and learning about writing letters. They have enjoyed thinking about facial expressions and the words we use to show our feelings too. Watch out for their assembly in November where they will be able to tell you more!



Woodpecker Class and the Secrets of St. Nicholas' Church

As a school we were asked to support our church with an exhibition to celebrate the opening of the church vault. Each class in the school focused on a different aspect of the church and Woodpecker Class based their learning on the stained glass windows. The children visited St Nicholas' Church and met with Rev. Dr David Jarrett.



First they were struck with how beautiful some of the patterns were in the east window behind the altar. They explored the symmetry in designs, and the colours, and used this as the inspiration for their own symmetrical rose windows. The children also loved the window that depicted St Nicholas. Back in class they studied figure and form and tried to draw people in proportion. It was trickier than they thought but they used their 'Growth Mindsets', to produce traditional Victorian style windows that showed St. George and the Dragon. Finally they learnt about how the windows told stories and how Jesus' life and death was depicted in the east window.

Pheasant Class



As part of their most recent Learning Journey, Pheasant class walked to Priory Park (and the Novium Museum) to learn all about the centenary celebrations of the park. Along with a visit from celebrated local author Chris Joyce, their challenge was to write an amazing story for the Novium Writing competition about "A Park Adventure". We can't wait to see who wins the competition!



Skipping Day



We recently had a fabulous whole school skipping day, led by Emily from a sports provider called "Dan the Skipping Man". Every child in school had a fabulous day, learning new skills with their "Growth Mindsets" firmly in place, and building their fitness. We will now add skipping to our list of fitness options we include in our "Fifteen Minutes of Fitness" every day and aim to be the best skippers we can be. Let's get skipping!

It was great that so many of you were able to join us for our Harvest Festival this year.
