## Winter Ready

## COVID-19 update

With cases of COVID continuing to be high nationally, and particularly high in a number of local schools, we are continuing to be vigilant at school. High emphasis on washing hands regularly is ongoing and all of our teaching spaces continue to be well-ventilated. If you or your child displays any of the COVID-19 symptoms, please inform the school office without delay and arrange for a PCR test to be taken before sending your child into school. In addition to COVID cases, we are also seeing a surge of colds and bugs around school. Please can I remind you that child must not return to school within 48 hours of vomiting.
