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Dear Parents Friday 18<sup>th</sup> February

I am so sorry for any inconvenience caused by the school remaining closed today. Due to the red weather warning which includes a 'risk of flying debris resulting to danger to life' a directive was given to all West Sussex Headteachers instructing us to keep our schools closed.

It was so encouraging to see parents back in school this week looking at children's books. We had a very strong take up of parent consultations, and I thank you all for your cooperation in meeting with your child's teacher via zoom. We are hoping that this will be the last time that parent evenings will be held in this way and, as COVID rates are finally again falling, we will also be continuing to rollout our usual wealth of exciting enrichment activities. One step we are taking in our return to normality is to revert to one entry and exit point into the school grounds. Therefore, from 1<sup>st</sup> March the green gates leading directly onto the school field will not be opened at the start or end of the school day. Please can all parents and children enter via the wooden gates adjacent to the school hall.

Although January and February are not the most exciting months of the year, that hasn't stopped our children engaging in many exciting Learning Journeys at school. The children in Pheasant class discovered a dragon's egg hidden in the school grounds that led them into learning all about adaptation and evolution. Woodpecker Class have been exploring the life of wolves and their habitats, whilst Key stage one have been helping Cinderella find the best material to make a waterproof coat. Children in Wren class have made the most of frosty mornings, learning all about the weather, whilst also writing stories for Baby Bear's bedtime.

We are committed to growing confident and passionate readers at our school and thanks to a very generous donation, each class has recently purchased £100 of new books to inspire and engage the children in their reading journey.
