#### **Growing Passionate Readers**

regularly at home, as well as at school, makes a significant difference to children's confidence and enjoyment of reading. If reading together is not a regular routine in your house, I urge you to make it a new habit, and there is no better time to start than the Easter holidays. Establishing positive reading habits together, or incorporating it into bedtime routines will have a huge impact on your child's attitude towards reading. This time does not need to be arduous or drawn out. Even a page a night, if appropriate, will pay huge dividends. Little and often is best.
