# Your Child's Safety E-Safety

The physical and emotional wellbeing, and safety of your children is always of the utmost importance to us and it is a subject that is continually revisited by staff and children as children progress though the school. As part of this work, just before half term, our children in year 6 visited West Dean C.E Primary school to participate in a workshop lead by e-safety expert, Mr Alan Mackenzie. During the workshop, the children explored how to stay safe online and discussed how to use social media safely and responsibly. Staff also attended additional training on this subject to ensure our understanding of this growing issue remains up to date.

#### **Bullying**

We are very pleased that incidents of bullying are very rare at our school. If however, any child reports that they, or another child, may be being bullied, this is something we take very seriously. Children are able to report any concerns they have to any adult in school who will always listen to them and take any issues raised seriously. All children involved are spoken to and full accounts of any accusations are listened to and acted upon. If the situation is considered to be of a bullying nature, parents of all children involved are contacted and we work together to find a swift resolution to the problem. All staff are made aware of ongoing concerns and are vigilant in monitoring relationships in class and on the play ground.

# **Sensitive issues**

We are very aware that during their time with us, many children go through difficult times due to friendships or external family cirumstances. Please assure your child that if, at any time, they are worried or struggling with a particular issue they can always speak to any adult who will take their concerns seriously and offer a listening ear. All teachers will be reiterating this message to children over the next few days.
