Our First Learning Journey

This term we are continuing with our smaller units of learning, Learning Journeys, where we try to give the children a real purpose for their learning culminating in an exciting writing opportunity.

We are starting with The Celts and Romans. A big thank you to all who embraced our homework challenge, to find out about our local Roman History. We had a fantastic response and are very impressed with all your efforts. These are being displayed in class and if you would like to pop in and have a look, do feel free!

OTHER LEARNING JOURNEYS THIS TERM

Over the course of this term, the children will be engaging with a range of other learning on various subjects.

After our work on The Celts and Romans we will be looking at biographies and the work of some Sculptors, mainly Barbara Hepworth. We will be using our trip to the Cass Sculpture Foundation Park at Goodwood to inspire the children to create their own sculptures. (You can help us by gathering a range of materials that we can use for our sculptures including, cereal boxes, cardboard tubes (not toilet rolls though), plastic inner packaging for cakes, foil containers, egg boxes, polystyrene packaging, basically anything that will make an interesting sculpture. (Please could any bits brought in be clean and dry!! Thank you)

After half term we will be embarking on a very exciting Science and DT Learning Journey which we have entitled Lavant Lift Off!!! (Think Bognor Birdman - but slightly smaller!!)

Following this, will be a whole school Learning Journey where we will study our local farming history. We have some exciting trips planned already to The Weald and Downland Museum and another visit to Tuppenny Barn to do some food planting, harvesting and cooking. The culmination of this learning will be presented to you at our whole school event- details to follow soon.

As the summer holiday approaches we will be finishing the term with a maths and geography Learning Journey which will develop the children's mapping and direction skills involving treasure hunting/geo caching!!

OTHER TOPICS

MFL

In French we will be focusing on food. The children will learn naming vocabulary as well as learn to ask and answer simple questions related to these areas.

RE

The children will be looking at a unit that will help them understand 'What is the Trinity?' They will look at John's Gospel of the life and teaching of Jesus and his letter to the Corinthians, looking for evidence of the Trinity.

PSCHE

To prepare for the new academic year we will be focusing on moving on and making changes. This will help the children with their transitions into new year groups after the summer holidays.

Computing
