Winter Ready



As the autumnal weather is well upon us now, please can you ensure that all children bring a warm waterproof coat to school every day. We aim to get all the children outside at playtimes even when it is cold and damp so that everyone has some fresh air and a chance to run around. We encourage children to continue playing on the school field at lunch times but do insist that they have a change of footwear and an old pair of tracksuit bottoms to put on. Please remember that in winter all children must wear smart school shoes in school, no boots or trainers please.

School Medication

As many of you are aware, we keep a stock of Capol, Piriteze, emergency asthma inhalers and Epi-pens in school. These essential items are needing to be replenished increasingly more frequently and the associated costs have significantly risen over recent years. If at any time, you feel able to make a small contribution towards these items, please place a cash donation in a marked envelope in the office post box in the school foyer.

Attendance

There is a clear link between academic outcomes and school attendance and we want all pupils to achieve excellent outcomes to give themselves the very best chance in life. In line with our Bishop Luffa Partnership schools, we have recently updated our Attendance Policy which sees small tweaks to some of our practices regarding school absence. The following extract is from the Trust policy which outlines new procedures for requesting absence form school:

Leave of Absence Requests - 'Exceptional Circumstances'

The law does not grant parents the automatic right to take their child out of school during term time.

Only exceptional circumstances warrant an authorised leave of absence. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance. The school will consider each application individually, considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background



















context behind the request. The request must be made by the parent with whom the child normally lives, and permission must be sought in advance. The school will not grant leave of absence unless there are exceptional circumstances. The school must be satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances, based on the individual facts and circumstances of the case; following consultation with other staff as required, including the Designated Safeguarding Lead. Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days the pupil can be away from school. A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion.

Circumstances which could be authorised include significant family emergencies or funerals. However, parents will also be aware that, wherever possible, it can be better for children to continue to attend school normally during difficult family times.

Parents should complete an 'Application for an Absence During Term Time' form, available from the school office or website. Once completed, it should be returned to the school office for processing.

We are extremely fortunate that incidences of bullying are very low at our school but each and every possible case is always taken seriously. Time is always taken to talk to all those involved, and if bullying is suspected, parents will

immediately be informed as we work together to support those affected.

Organisation is now well underway for our Christmas Fair which, this year, is being held on Saturday 29th November. We will be holding a donation day on 7th November. On this day the children will be able to wear non-school uniform in return for bringing in items to the fair. Please do all make a real effort to support this excellent event which raises a huge amount of funds for our school, whilst getting everyone in the Christmas spirit.
